	 <u>Comments of IFD, MoE</u>: May be noted. <u>Comments of Bureau, MoE</u>: One of items at B.O.G.20.42.5 under it is pertinent to mention here that as per extant norms applicable to Higher Educational Institutions, the ratio of teaching to non teaching staff is to be maintained at 1:1.1. A Committee has been set up to frame the common RR for non-teaching staff in IISERs. Its report is expected soon. The report may be awaited. The Director informed that while sending its comments regarding this agenda item at the time of 42nd meeting of BoG, the Ministry of Education, Finance Division has already concurred the proposal of the Institute. Thereafter, the BoG in its 42nd meeting resolved that the Institute may go ahead for the recruitment of 07 categories of non-faculty positions which have been mapped with the NIT RRs. For other 10 categories of the posts, the recommendations of the BoG may be sent to the Ministry for approval.
	Accordingly, the recruitment process of 07 categories of posts is already under process and for other 10 categories of posts, the process will be initiated after the approval of CRRs by MoE.

B.O.G.21.43.05	Item arising from the Special Meeting of the Finance Committee held on 18.02.2021.
SP. F.C.21.01.03	Release of amount to CPWD for payment of arbitration award towards construction of Hostels in 2014:
	CPWD vide its letter No.20(13)/EE/PGIMER/P/2020/336 dated 14.12.2020 has informed the Institute about the outcome of an Arbitration case pertaining to construction in 2014 of two Hostels, by which an amount of Rs.2,28,46,415/- is payable by the Institute to the claimant.
	The matter was discussed in the meeting of the Institute's Building & Works Committee held on 01.02.2021. The B&WC had recommended that the CPWD be asked to challenge the award in the court, and the Institute has informed the CPWD accordingly. However, the CPWD has replied that since there was no concrete ground to challenge this case the award was accepted. If the levy of penal interest

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	was to be avoided, this amount was to be paid before 22-02-2021. The Institute has requested to the MoE for release of the total awarded amount i.e. Rs.2,28,46,415/-before 22.02.2021. The payment had to be made before 22.02.2021 to avoid penal interest and hence, the matter was placed before the Finance Committee for consideration and approval.
	In view of the legal opinion and to avoid the penal interest, the Finance Committee, after detailed deliberations, resolved that the amount of Rs.2,28,46,415/- may be released by the Institute to the CPWD before 22 February, 2021.
	At the same time, the Finance Committee has also resolved that the matter may be taken up with the CPWD to obtain all the relevant documents presented by the CPWD during arbitration process and also the grounds for not challenging the arbitration award in the court of law. A report in this regard may be presented by the Institute in the next meeting of the Finance Committee.
	The Finance Committee has also resolved that in future, the MoU, if any, to be signed between IISER Mohali and CPWD for construction of buildings/services, it should have suitable safeguards to minimize the chances of arbitration and should preferably have a provision which keeps the Institute informed about the arbitration proceedings should they arise.
	Accordingly, the Institute has made the payment of the Arbitration Award to CPWD on 22.02.2021 and also requested the CPWD to send the documents as desired by the Ministry/Finance Committee.
	The Institute has also examined copies of MoUs of CPWD with other IISERs and IITs/ IISERs/Central Universities to determine the arrangements for arbitration proceedings therein. In all cases, CPWD bears the sole responsibility for defending its client during arbitration, and the Institute would like to submit that the same arrangement be permitted here as well. This is because of a lack of suitable and sufficient expertise for the organization to take any responsibility in the arbitration proceedings.
	The Board of Governors is requested to consider and approve the payment of Arbitration Award amounting to Rs.2,28,46,415/
	<u>Comments of IFD, MoE</u> : May be considered. Since the Institute was not part of the arbitration of the arbitration proceedings, should have challenged in the court of law.

	The Institute is in the process of filling up several vacant non-teaching posts, and is also awaiting approval for its Recruitment Rules in this regard. Given the large administrative load and current very small strength of non-teaching staff in position (only 42, which has remained unchanged since 2018), the institute has historically relied upon outsourced office staff at the lower pay levels to meet its requirements. However, this arrangement is quite unsatisfactory since these individuals have not been chosen through advertisement and yet many have been in position for more than ten years, a situation which might possibly lead to adverse consequences for the Institute in future. Recently, the Institute has also advertised 04 posts of Assistant Registrar which were already sanctioned. However, the supporting staff will definitely be required to the Assistant
	sanctioned. However, the supporting staff will definitely be required to the Assistant
	Registrars for carrying out their assignments.
	Therefore, in order to reduce the need for hiring outsourced staff, approval of the BoG is requested for the institute to fill upto 28 non-teaching posts below Matrix level 8 (GP of Rs. 4800 or less) on contract basis through advertisement, as provided for in Clause 20(2) of the IISER statutes. These posts are a subset of less than one-third of the above 85 positions previously approved by the BoG and awaiting Govt's sanction, and these contractual positions will be extinguished as and when the regular positions are sanctioned and are filled through advertisement. The draft IISER Common Recruitment Rules which are under consideration of the Ministry will be used for the contractual recruitment process and the initial appointment will be made for a period of one year.
	<u>Comments of IFD, MoE</u> : May be considered. Contractual employees should be offered lumpsum payments. Pay matrix levels are not applicable to them.
	<u>Comments of Bureau, MoE</u> : A Committee has been set up to frame the common RR
	for non-teaching staff in IISERs. Its report is expected soon. The report may be
	awaited.
	The Director explained that the IFD, MoE, in principle, concurred the proposal of the Institute vide its aforesaid comments. In response to the comments of the

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	Bureau, MoE, he informed that these are related to 54 vacant positions (out of earlier sanctioned 96 posts) whereas the present proposal of the Institute is to fill up 28 posts, out of 85 posts recommended by BoG in its 41 st meeting and sent to the Ministry for approval.
	The Director added that the proposed recruitment of 28 posts will be made purely on contract basis, at the lower level i.e. Group 'B' and 'C' initially for one year only. Their salary will be fixed as per DoPT guidelines on contract appointments. This will also help to reduce the expenditure on OH31 for which the Ministry is pressing upon.
Decision	After detailed deliberations, the Board of Governors resolved that the Institute may go ahead to fill up 28 non-faculty positions purely on contract basis, initially for a period of one year or till the regular appointments are made, whichever is earlier. Their salary will be fixed as per DoPT guidelines on contract appointments. The BoG also resolved that with these contractual appointments, the Institute may be able to reduce the expenditure under OH31, as directed by the Ministry.
B.O.G.21.43.08	Matter pertaining to the joining of Dr. Ishan Agarwal as Assistant Professor:Dr. Ishan Agarwal was offered the position of Assistant Professor in Pay Level-12 in the Department of Biological Sciences at IISER Mohali. While verifying the documents submitted by Dr. Ishan at the time of his joining (in person) on 18.01.2021, it has been noticed that the proceedings of a Criminal Case No.1206/2012 (State of M.P. Vs. Ishaan Agrawal & Others) are pending against him before the Chief Judicial Magistrate, District Panna, Madhya Pradesh arising from the Forest Offence Case No.372/2014 registered under various Sections of the Wild Life (Protection) Act. He had also stated that he had filed the petitions in the Hon'ble High Court of MP and the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to quash the aforesaid proceedings pending before the Court of CJM but the same were dismissed.
	Under the circumstances, the Institute had decided to seek the legal opinion with regard to the acceptance of his joining report and till the receipt of legal opinion, his joining has been kept on 'Hold".
	The legal opinion received from the Legal Counsel of the Institute which, <i>interalia</i> , provides that his joining report should not be accepted and that the offer letter should be withdrawn alongwith his joining report (copy of legal opinion is attached at (<i>Page Nos.:22 to 24 of the Agenda</i>). Therefore, the Institute has decided to keep the offer of his appointment in abeyance until the matter is put up to the BoG for a suitable decision.
	Needless to add, the appointment of Dr. Ishan Agarwal was made through a highly competitive and rigorous selection process and was approved by the BoG.
	In view of above, the matter of Dr Ishan's joining is placed before the Board of Governors

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	for consideration and further direction, please.		
	<u>Comments of IFD, MoE</u> : May be considered. <u>Comments of Bureau, MoE</u> : Decision may be taken keeping the view of the legal counsel.		
	The Director informed that due to some legal issues involved in this matter, the Institute obtained the legal opinion.		
	He further informed that the selection of Dr. Ishan Agarwal had been made through a highly competitive and rigorous process which was approved by the Board of Governors. His academic credentials are excellent.		
	In view of the facts and circumstances of the case and the deliberations took thereon, the BoG expressed the following two options: -		
	1) Dr Ishan may be allowed to join the Institute on probation but he will be confirmed only after he is discharged or acquitted in the case; OR		
	2) His appointment may be kept in abeyance till a certain period and if he is discharged or acquitted in the case, he may be allowed to join the Institute.		
	With regard to Option at 1), it has been felt that no one can be retained on probation for a longer period. As per DoPT guidelines, the total period of probation cannot exceed the double the prescribed period of probation. In Dr. Ishan's case, the prescribed period of probation is one year.		
	Thereafter, the second Option at 2) was deliberated upon to which all members agreed.		
Decision	After detailed deliberations, the Board of Governors resolved that Dr. Ishan Agarwal is not to join the Institute unless he is acquitted or discharged in the ongoing criminal court case against him. Accordingly, the offer of appointment of Dr. Ishan Agarwal may be kept in abeyance for a period not exceeding 18 months from the date of decision of the BoG i.e. 30.03.2021. In case, Dr. Ishan is discharged or acquitted in the case during these 18 months, he will be allowed to join the Institute.		
B.O.G.21.43.09	Sabbatical Leave to faculty members at IISER Mohali:		
	The Manual for Faculty Members, approved by the Board of Governors in its 16 th meeting held on 24.05.2016, makes a provision of Sabbatical Leave for the faculty members of the Institute (<i>Page Nos.:25 to 27 of the Agenda</i>) Regarding period of service to be spent at the Institute after return from Sabbatical Leave, clause 11.5.3 of the Manual, provides, " <i>At least two full semesters should have been spent after availing a Short Leave</i> ". The provisions regarding period of service to be spent at the Institute after returning from the Sabbatical Leave are not same in all the educational institutions viz. IITs/IISERs. Some Institutions have also the provisions of executing a bond of certain amounts. E.g. in IISER		

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	Bhopal, the person granted Long Leave will execute a bond to serve the Institute for a period of one year on return from the leave if the Long Leave is upto one year and for a period of three years if the Long Leave is for more than one year. The bond will be for a sum of Rs.10,000/ In IISc Bangalore, the faculty should have at least one year of service after return from sabbatical leave but no mention about the financial implication.		
	In view of above, the Board of Governors is requested to consider and approve to amend Clause 11.5.3 of the Manual, as follows:		
	"The faculty member granted Sabbatical Leave will execute a bond to serve the Institute for a period of one year on return from the Sabbatical Leave if the leave is upto one year OR refund the salary received during the period of Sabbatical Leave".		
	<i>Comments of IFD, MoE: May be considered.</i> <i>Comments of Bureau, MoE: It may be as per the relevant instructions and practice in other IISERs.</i>		
	The BoG deliberated that the period of service and/or the amount to be returned, in case, a faculty does not spend the minimum requisite period after returning from the Sabbatical Leave, are varied in all educational institutions viz. IITs/IISERs.		
Decision	After deliberations, the BoG resolved to amend Clause 11.5.2 of the Manual regarding Sabbatical Leave as, "The faculty member granted Sabbatical Leave will have to serve for a period of one year on return from the Sabbatical Leave OR refund the salary received during the period of Sabbatical Leave, as the case may be".		
B.O.G.21.43.10	Regularization of upgradation of various non-faculty positions:		
	The BoG in its 25 th meeting held on 05.10.2016 had approved that EE, AR, PAs/ Accountants/Superintendents and PS be placed in the Grade Pay of Rs.7600/-, Rs.6600/-, Rs.4600/- and Rs.4800/-, respectively, as there is no promotion policy. However, there were representations against these upgradations from several individuals within as well as outside the Institute, the Director, IISER Mohali had constituted a Fact Finding Committee to look into the promotion/financial upgradation granted to the non-teaching staff after 06 years at IISER Mohali, in connection with some representations from the non-faculty employees and some other individuals of the Institute. All these financial upgradations were made before the present Director and the present Registrar joined the Institute. A copy of the report of Fact Finding Committee is attached as (<i>Page Nos.:28 to 29 of the Agenda</i>).		
	 The FFC in its report states that the decisions so far of the BoG and the communications from MHRD present a hazy picture regarding the applicability of promotion policy and the financial upgradation in the Institute. In their summary opinion, the FFC has stated that: i) Financial upgradation is applicable to only those non-teaching positions, wherever prescribed under NIT RRs, as per the MHRD directive (17.03.2017). Only following posts are covered under NIT RRs for financial upgradation:- a) Executive Engineer 		

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b) Assistant Registrar However, the NIT RRs have been specifically approved only on 29.10.2020.
 ii) Only MACP is applicable for the staff at IISER Mohali as on date. iii) DPCs held on 26/07/17 & 06/06/19 could not have been held in view of the decisions of the BoG and MHRD observations received upto and prior to the date of holding the DPC. iv) In future DPCs can be held in accordance with the RRs in vogue at that time.
It is also relevant to mention that the financial upgradations made so far are very few in numbers and have been granted in the absence of any promotion policy for the non-faculty employees working since a long time.
Therefore, the BoG is requested to look into this matter sympathetically in the cases of all upgradations that were done in the past with the approval of BoG on 05.10.2016. In any case, the upgradations of Executive Engineer and Assistant Registrars would appear to be in order from date of MHRD observations dated 17.03.2017 that the Institute can adopt NIT RRs.
 <u>Comments of IFD, MoE</u>: Upgradation of pay scales needs express approval of the Ministry on advice of Deptt. of Expenditure. Proposal needs examination in the Ministry. <u>Comments of Bureau, MoE</u>: Ministry has asked to conduct a fresh fact finding enquiry and also to fix responsibility on the concerned officials. A decision may be taken on the basis of the report.
The Director, while briefing agenda item, informed that as desired by the MoE, vide its letter dated 23 rd March, 2021, the details in the form of a table indicating names, number of employees, etc. who had been given financial upgradations, were shared with the BoG on 29.03.2021. As indicated in the table, such employees have been categorized under four categories, A, B, C & D.


